



- Nearly 80 species of birds
- Numerous species of lichen and moss
- Mammals ranging from the Douglas squirrel to black bears.



The Weatherwax is a wetland mitigation bank. It must contain wetlands and remain undeveloped:

- **Invasive species must be removed.**
- **The City of Ocean Shores maintains walking trails.**
- **The Coastal Interpretive Center helps with upkeep, interpretation, and conducts tours.**
- **Trails are indicated with easy to read signs and the outer loop is about 1.4 miles long.**

The City of Ocean Shores works with Washington Department of Ecology and US Army Corps of Engineers to maintain Weatherwax.

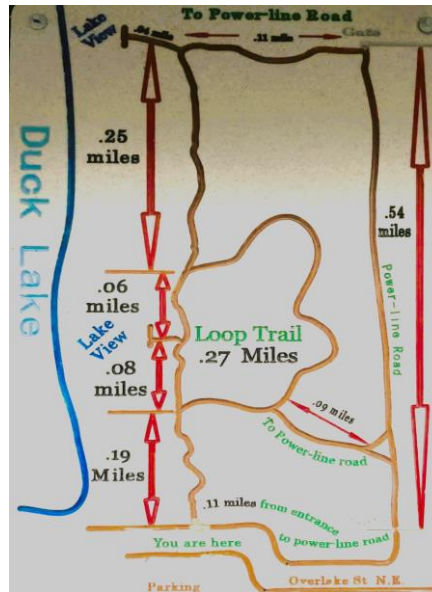




Diverse communities of fungi and flowering plants are found in the understory.
